Dreams – from the Quran and Sunnah

Dreams, whether sweet or scary, are something that everyone experiences. The best way to learn about dreams is to devote our focus into the books of Sunnah. Let's start with Saheeh Al-Bukhari.

Narrated Anas bin Malik:

Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) said, "A good dream (that comes true) of a righteous man is one of forty-six parts of prophetism."

Narrated Abu Qatada:

The Prophet (ﷺ) said, "A good dream that comes true is from Allah, and a bad dream is from Satan, so if anyone of you sees a bad dream, he should seek refuge with Allah from Satan and should spit on the left (in another narration thrice), for the bad dream will not harm him." In another report "shouldn't tell it to anyone."

Narrated Abu Huraira:

I heard the Prophet (ﷺ) saying, "Whoever sees me in a dream will see me in his wakefulness, and Satan cannot imitate me in shape." Abu `Abdullah said, "Ibn Seereen said, 'Only if he sees the Prophet (ﷺ) in his (real) shape.'"

Narrated Abu Huraira:

Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) said, "When the Day of Resurrection approaches, the dreams of a believer will hardly fail to come true, and a dream of a believer is one of forty-six parts of prophetism, and whatever belongs to prothetism can never be false." Muhammad bin Seereen said, "But I say this," he said, "It used to be said, 'There are three types of dreams: The reflection of one's thoughts and experiences one has during wakefulness, what is suggested by Satan to frighten the dreamer, or glad tidings from Allah. So, if someone has a dream which he dislikes, he should not tell it to others, but get up and offer a prayer.'"

Narrated Ibn `Abbas:

The Prophet (ﷺ) said, "Whoever claims to have seen a dream which he did not see, will be ordered to make a knot between two barley grains which he will not be able to do..."

Narrated Ibn `Umar:

Allah's Messenger (ﷺ) said, "The worst lie is that a person claims to have seen a dream which he has not seen."

Narrated Abu Salama:

I used to see a dream which would make me sick till I heard Abu Qatada saying, "I too, used to see a dream which would make me sick till I heard the Prophet (ﷺ) saying, "A good dream is from Allah, so if anyone of you saw a dream which he liked, he should not tell it to anybody except to the one whom he loves, and if he saw a dream which he disliked, then he should seek refuge with Allah from its evil and from the evil of Satan, and spit three times (on his left) and should not tell it to anybody, for it will not harm him. "

Imam Muslim reported from Jaabir that the Prophet (ﷺ) said: "If any one of you sees a dream that he dislikes, let him spit to his left three times, and seek refuge with Allaah from the Shaytaan three times, and turn over from the side on which he was sleeping."

Ibn Maajah reported on the authority of Abu Razeen that the prophet (ﷺ) said: It was narrated from Abu Razin that he heard the Prophet (ﷺ) say: "Dreams are attached to the foot of a bird* until they are interpreted, then when they are interpreted they come to pass." He said: "And dreams are one of the forty-six parts of prophecy." He (the narrator) said: "And I think he said: '(A person) should not tell them except to one whom he loves or one who is wise.'" [Al-Albaani – no problem with supporting evidences, see Silsilah 1/238]

Addition from the hadith of Abu Huraira reported by Imam Tirmidhi: And he would say: "The dream is not to be narrated except to a knowledgeable person or a sincere advisor." [Saheeh – Albaani]

From the hadith of Abu Razeen in Tirmidhi: "And it should not be discussed except with an intelligent one or a beloved one." [Saheeh – Al-Albaani]
