Seeing Allaah – the belief of Ahl as sunnah wal Jama’ah

- Seeing Allaah is only possible if Allaah wants Him to be seen.
- No one can see Allaah in this dunya with his/her naked eyes!
- But believers will be able to see Allaah in the hereafter.

- several verses indicate directly and indirectly that Allah will be seen in the hereafter.
- There are several authentic hadith that clearly state Allaah will be seen with the naked eyes by the believers only.
- Seeing Allaah is real, not metaphoric
- There is no authentic hadith from the sahabah that they claimed the Prophet (sallallaahu ‘alayhi wa sallam) saw Allaah during Isra wal Me’raj!
- It is claimed that Ibn ‘Abbas said that the prophet (sallallahu ‘alayhi wa sallam) saw Allaah during Isra wal me’raj, however what is authentic from him is that Ibn ‘Abbas said the prophet sallallaahu ‘alayhi wa sallam saw Allah with his heart!
- The Prophet saw the light of Hijab during Isra wal me’raj, he didn’t see Allaah [hadith of Abu Dhar]
- Allah will appear to the believers in a suura that they will not recognize him and then will appear in a suura that they will recognize him.
- For the people of Jannah, Allah will allow the veil to be lifted and they will see Allaah.
- If Allaah were to lift the veil and look at the creation then the subuhaat of his face would burn everything.
- Ahl as sunnah believes Allaah can’t be seen in this dunya but in the hereafter Allaah will be seen only by the believers.
- The sufis claimed Allaah can be seen in this life and hereafter! The khawarij and other heretic sects claimed Allaah can’t be seen in this life and in the hereafter!

Narrations about seeing Allaah in the hereafter

Suhaib reported the Apostle (ﷺ) saying: When those deserving of Paradise would enter Paradise, the Blessed and the Exalted would ask: Do you wish Me to give you anything more? They would say: Hast Thou not brightened our faces? Hast Thou not made us enter Paradise and saved us from Fire? He (the narrator) said: He (God) would lift the veil, and of things given to them nothing would be dearer to them than the sight of their Lord, the Mighty and the Glorious. [Sahih Muslim]

Narrated Jarir:

We were sitting with the Prophet (ﷺ) and he looked at the moon on the night of the full-moon and said, "You people will see your Lord as you see this full moon, and you will have no trouble in seeing Him, so if you can avoid missing (through sleep or business, etc.) a prayer before sunrise (Fajr) and a prayer before sunset (‘Asr) you must do so." (See Hadith No. 529, Vol. 1) [Bukhari]
